At Elim Christian College Henderson, every aspect of our school's framework has been thoughtfully crafted to nurture, mentor, and develop our ākonga. We are thrilled to share our School Structure Narrative, created at the inception of our establishment. This document details the intentional choices that define our organisational design and the significant symbolism represented in each name and group. Akomanga (Classes)

Named after native manu (birds), our akomanga reflect the nurturing care described in *Matthew* 13:31-32 and Matthew 6:26. Just as birds instinctively trust and rely upon their environment, we strive for our students to implicitly trust their kaiako for guidance, knowledge, and support.

Tīma (Teams)

Our tīma, inspired by features of ao-mārama (the physical world), symbolize the collective journey of learning and personal growth. Rooted in scripture from **Deuteronomy 10:11** and Jeremiah 29:11, these teams represent careful preparation, thoughtful guidance, and the promise of flourishing **futures** for each student.

Te Whare o Rakau (Houses)

Each whare is named after a native rākau (tree), highlighting interconnectedness, stability, and growth as depicted in John 15:5 and **Psalm 1:3**. Our whare system promotes a strong sense of **belonging**, enabling students to thrive within a supportive community.
