Curriculum Update: BSLA & Maths No Problem

We're excited to introduce the **Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA) for our New Entrant to Year 2 ākonga** at Elim Henderson. This innovative approach is tailored for our New Zealand context and has been proven effective in supporting early literacy skills.

BSLA focuses on teaching critical phonological awareness, letter sound knowledge, vocabulary, and oral comprehension skills. Through fun activities and structured reading sessions, ākonga will build a strong foundation in literacy.

Our approach includes regular assessments to monitor your child's progress and provide targeted support. We believe in the importance of whānau involvement, which is why BSLA includes workshops, weekly updates, and strengths-based reporting for parents.

We're confident that BSLA will provide our ākonga with the tools they need for literacy success. Thank you for your support as we embark on this journey together. For further information, please check out <u>BSLA website</u>.



Our kurais excited to announce the adoption of the **Maths – No Problem! programme**, which aims to cultivate a strong mathematical foundation for ākonga from New Entrant through Year 8, instilling confidence and deep understanding in all ākonga.

At the heart of the Maths — No Problem! programme lies the CPA approach: Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract. This systematic method ensures that ākonga engage with mathematical concepts in a progressive manner. Beginning with hands-on materials (concrete), students move to visual representations (pictorial), and eventually advance to symbolic notation (abstract). This gradual transition fosters a deeper understanding of mathematics and enhances retention and application of knowledge.

By incorporating inclusive activities, problem-solving approaches, and varied examples, Maths — No Problem! caters to the diverse needs of learners, ensuring accessibility for all while challenging advanced ākonga.

With Maths — No Problem!, our kura is committed to providing a supportive learning environment where all tamariki can thrive as a confident mathematician. Through its systematic approach and research-backed methodologies, we aim to empower ākonga to excel in mathematics and beyond.



BSLA – Information session for Whānau of Year 0 - 2 students

Our kura is implementing an enhancement to our reading curriculum called the **Better Start Literacy Approach**. This approach has been developed in New Zealand by a team of experienced researchers from the University of Canterbury, following years of research on the **best ways to support early reading, writing and oral language success for tamariki**. In akomanga (class), we will share exciting storybooks that will help grow the number of new and interesting words that your children can use and understand when talking. We will also be playing games that **develop phonological awareness knowledge for tamariki** – **or their awareness of the sounds within words**. This area is particularly important to help your tamariki learn to read and spell.

We are also making some changes to our reading groups. You may notice a change in the kinds of books coming home in your tamariki bookbag. The Better Start Literacy Approach uses carefully chosen texts to provide opportunities to practice reading. The words in the books are closely related to the letters and sounds we are teaching in akomanga. There will be lots of opportunities to practice sounding out words made from letters and sounds that they know or are learning – **building their confidence and skill as readers.**

To give you more information on how this will look in our kura, we will be holding an information session for all parents, caregivers and whānau of Year 0 - 2 students.

Reminder on Drop-Off and Pick-Up

At Elim Christian College Henderson, the safety and well-being of our ākonga, kaimahi, and whānau are our top priorities. With this in mind, we wanted to take time and clarify our drop-off and pick-up guidelines.

Due to the nature of the site, we request that all ākonga are dropped off and picked up from the atrium or designated carpark at the end of our driveway. To ensure safe departure from school we do not permit ākonga to exit the driveway on foot at any time. We encourage parents and caregivers to utilise the parking facilities available on our premises. Should you wish to accompany your child into the school atrium, you are welcome to do so.

We will provide supervision in a communal space from 8:15 AM onwards which is when our facilities open. Prior to this, they will need to be under parental supervision.

At the end of the school day, ākonga are requested to promptly head home. It's important to note that for health and safety reasons, both whānau and ākonga are asked to vacate the school grounds by 3:15 PM, as kaimahi attend to other responsibilities.

BYOD & BSON

At Elim Christian College
Henderson, we follow our Digital
Technology and Online Safety
policy to create a learning
environment that promotes the safe
and responsible use of digital
technology.

Part of this commitment is educating ākonga on manners such as digital citizenship, being safe online (BSON) while also providing exposure to and training in using a range tools that can aid their learning, such as the Google suite, CANVA and others. Each tool we introduce has been carefully considered and explored prior to it's introdcution to ākonga.

Students may bring their own device to school for learning to enhance their digital literacy. We also have three 'PODS' of devices stationed in our wharepukapuka (library), in Rūma - Kekeno, our technology suite, and some dedicated to Māunga, our junior whānau group (Y0-2). Our kaiako are familiar with and have to access these.

While we make a concerted effort to safeguard ākonga, including the monitoring and reviewing of student device and internet use (via Network 4 Learning, and our ICT Provider, Norrcom), we encourage whānau to take the necessary steps to ensure they feel comfortable. This may include installing software on personal devices brought onto school premises or other actions you deem suitable.

Another means of ensuring ākonga are safe online and all parties are aware of the protocols and safeguards we have in place is to review our BYOD Agreement (or BYOD Information) found on the school website in our communications tab.

We find that in perusing this together and answering patai (questions) your tamariki may have, creates a solid foundation to build not only their competence, but their confidence in navigating the online world. We thank you for your efforts in partnering with us to guide and protect ākonga.

Y7/8 IMMUNISATIONS

Te Whatu Ora regularly visit intermediate aged ākonga to provide immunisations. We have liaised with them to arrange for this to occur later this year, should you choose to utilise this service. Please view the information they have shared with us below:

Year 7 students will be offered Boostrix vaccine (Tdap) in school. This vaccine is a booster of tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough (pertussis). Most children received these immunisations last as preschoolers. This is scheduled for 30th of May 2024 with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day.

Year 8 students will be offered human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in school. This is a New Zealand schedule vaccine that is recommended to be given at 12 years of age. Students need two doses with a 6-month gap between dose 1 and 2. This is scheduled for 30 th of May 2024 with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day.
