## Principal's Message

As a staff, we gather regularly to learn professionally and grow spiritually. It's a commitment we hold as leaders and kaiako in a Special Character School. Part of this routine allows us to hear from the leadership and pastoral team of Elim – an opportunity that I relish.

Today, rather than sharing a message directly from me, I wanted to relay my learnings from a devotion shared by Ps. Pete McArthur, the lead pastor of Elim Christian Centre Henderson.

In 2 Corinthians 12, we hear from Paul as he writes to the church in Corinth. Discussing what he refers to as "a thorn in his side", Paul unpacks his learnings from this experience. As we would expect, prayer and pleading were central acts in response to this hardship. In submitting himself and bringing this circumstance before the LORD, Paul claims that God said to him, "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness".

In a simple albeit profound manner, that I have grown accustomed to, Ps. Pete contextualises just how "odd" and "counter-cultural" this train of thought is — not only in our day and age but also in the Roman customs. He proceeded to share that we tend to view weakness as something to be hidden or masked. However, in doing this we miss out on a valuable opportunity.

While this message was deeply resonant for myself and our staff – many whom thanked Ps. Pete for bringing this message – I can't help but see the beautiful implications of this for our ākonga. How wonderful to know, to truly and deeply realise, that while accomplishments and achievements are worthwhile pursuits, our "weaknesses" are equally valuable ways to acknowledge and experience the grace and power of God.

Paul ends by telling us then "when I am weak, then I am strong". May we continue to pray and learn that God is ever-present — in our wins but also our losses.

### Winter Uniform Standards

We would like to remind all students and families of the importance of presenting Elim Christian College with pride. Our Elim school uniform is a key part of our identity and reflects the high standards we uphold as a learning community. Full uniform guidelines can be found on our <u>school website</u>, and we encourage all families to review them regularly.

We are pleased to announce that in Terms 2 and 3, students in Years 0 - 6 have the option to wear long, plain black tracksuit pants instead of the school shorts or skort. Our Year 7 and 8 students are expected to continue to wear their shorts (for boys) or skirt (for girls), throughout the year, including Terms 2 and 3.

#### <u>Hair</u>

For girls whose hair reaches the collar, it must be tied up and off the face at all times – this includes to and from school. Hair tie colours are dark blue, black or white only.

Hair for boys must not reach the collar and must be off the face at all times.

As always, we ask students to ensure they are wearing the correct uniform items and that these are clean, well-fitted, and worn respectfully. The uniform is a symbol of our shared values, and we believe every student should wear it with pride.
