### SERVICE IN ACTION: SAMARITAN WEEK

In Week 8, we're bringing our theme of community and kindness to life through our newest initiative (and soon to be annual) **Samaritan Week** — a time when we learn, grow, and put our faith into practice. Guided by our motto reach, serve, influence and inspired by the story of the **Good Samaritan** in **Luke** 10:25–37, this week is a beautiful convergence of our learning, our values, and our philosophies.

Students across the school will **explore what service looks like** — not as an abstract idea, but as something deeply practical and close to home. Seniors will engage in learning about needs and service work in underdeveloped parts of the world. Our hope is that Samaritan Week will not just be something we do, but something we become — a community that notices needs, chooses kindness, and lives out the call to love our neighbour.

- Accepting postal votes until: Monday 15 September
- Results declared: Tuesday 16 September
- New Board takes office: Wednesday 17 September
